- Quantum Mechanics-a fundamental theory in physics that describes the behavior of nature at and below the scale of atoms.
- Quarks-a type of elementary particle and a fundamental constituent of matter.
- String Theory—a theoretical framework in which the point-like particles of particle physics are replaced by one-dimensional objects called strings.


